## **MAKE DISCIPLES!**

That is the reason behind the revamping of our Sunday night and Wednesday night schedules.

I will not try to summarize the new schedule here. You can find it easily in the Worship Folder insert and on our website, [www.sabc.org](http://www.sabc.org). I do want to tell you some things about the new schedule that I believe will enhance our disciple making.

We are trying to make Book 66 (a Bible memory program for children) more accessible to all of our children from preschool to preteen. Nothing makes better disciples than hiding God's Word in our hearts, and Book 66 is a fun and consistent way of accomplishing that!

We are starting Youth Discipleship on Sunday nights to enhance what they are already receiving on Sunday mornings and Wednesday nights. Preschool and Kidz Choirs will move to Sunday nights also, as we believe it is important to develop young worshippers.

Adults will have more Discipleship Class options on both Sunday and Wednesday nights. Yes, I plan to still teach classes at both times, but other options will be available as well.

We want to be faithful, growing, developing disciples of the Lord Jesus. We want to be making new disciples for Him also. Join us in Discipleship at St. Andrew!

# Discipleship | Evangelism

Wouldn't you agree that the first step in hitting a target is to know what you are aiming for? ## **A faithful and mature disciple of Christ will....**

**Exalt Christ** by faithfully studying and obeying the Word of God, regularly engaging with other believers in Spirit-filled worship, exhibiting the fruits of the Spirit, and praying continuously.

**Meet Needs** by faithfully serving God, selflessly serving others, joyfully giving through the local church, and praying continuously.

**Reach the World** by faithfully practicing the Acts 1:8 Strategy, intentionally discipling others to become faithful followers of Christ, and praying continuously.

## **“On the mountain of spiritual maturity, there is always another summit.”**

As you consider this definition, I'm asking you to pray about ways that you can grow as a faithful and mature disciple of Christ. In this article, I want to focus on the idea of there always being another summit on the mountain of spiritual maturity. Maybe a simpler way of saying it, but not as catchy, is this....we have not arrived. Each of us has room to grow in our understanding of the Scriptures and our application of its teachings.

This fall, as we make some changes to our strategy for making disciples, a part of that is offering more opportunities for adults to be involved in Bible Study on both Sunday and Wednesday evenings. With these additional opportunities come additional needs for leadership. I'm asking you to consider now where you will plug in. Will you serve with our preschoolers, kids, or youth? Will you join a discipleship group on Sunday or Wednesday evening? Whatever it is that God is leading you to, we have a place for you.

Your BUILDING 4 GENERATIONS TO COME Building Team has been quietly and prayerfully moving forward on our knees seeking God's will regarding a Design/Build Team to collaborate with as we work to accomplish the Scope of Work that you authorized in our meetings. We cannot, without coming back to the church for approval, change or expand the Scope of Work that you authorized.

The B4GTC Building Team has narrowed the search down and is working through finalization of choosing a Design/Build Team. Many of you have noticed holes drilled and patched in the front parking lot near the Bell Tower. Those were required to provide Geotechnical reports for the Design/Build team so that they could make educated recommendations about the Scope of Work that you approved. The expense for the testing, paid by a generous donation from an anonymous donor, allowed the B4GTC Building Team to move forward while interviewing Design/Build teams.

In our regularly scheduled Quarterly Business Meeting last Sunday night (8/12), the church approved the building Team's

recommendation to move to the initial phase of Master Planning and Preliminary Design with COSCO & Associates, Inc. The church approved the formulation of a Building Fund which will be called Building 4 Generations To Come or B4GTC so that those who desire can begin to give toward expenses now. And finally, the church approved the building team drawing on the Line of Credit to pay for the initial cost of the design work.

Although the Building Team has accomplished a great deal of work in preparation, there is a great deal left to do! Please pray for the team consisting of Danny Pate, Team Leader; Tim Barnard, Bethany Boggs, Lauren Hahn, Bruce Kuhnel, Terry Morris, John Skaggs, Christy Wortman, Bro. Mike Claunch and Bro. Rick.

# ON MISSION

Church Family,

We've just returned from an awesome week on mission in Baltimore, Maryland! If you were in worship Sunday, you heard the report that we saw 9 people begin following Christ as their Lord through the VBS at Village Church, and that we were able to work with Freedom church at their new location that will be launching later this month.

One of the most impactful things for me last week was not in the work that was done, but in the team that did it. We had a total of 22 team members ranging from 3 to in their 60s, and everything in between. We had families of 2, 3, and 4. We had single college students, single seniors, and married adults who came without their spouse. We had every demographic checked. This was a team that could have easily stuck near the people they knew, and not branch out to work with people that they are not normally around at church. But they didn't. This team experienced an incredible bond from the Lord that greatly enhanced our work and our relationships with one another and with the Lord. Doing this gave us a chance to learn about what people who are in a different place in life, or come from a different background, are going through. It gave us a chance to share wisdom that we have learned through our experiences walking with the Lord. More than all of that, we got to see a clear picture of

what a 4Gen church working in harmony looks like! And wow, it was a sight to see! I rejoiced all week as I saw an older adult sharing wisdom to a young person about how to follow Christ as a young adult and as College students spent time with children, giving them role models to look to for examples.

God truly did an amazing work in Baltimore, but He also did an amazing work among the team that went to Baltimore. All of us came home with a different perspective on how we can best serve the people God puts in front of us. We also came home with a better picture of how to build relationships with people that may not be natural to us. All of this happened because each member of this team was willing to go. Willing to leave their lives for a week to serve alongside their church. Willing to set aside their preconceptions and see people through the eyes of Christ.

I'm praying God will continue to work in this way through every single person at St. Andrew Baptist Church, and that we would all work faithfully as He uses us for His Glory in Panama City, in Baltimore, and all over the world!

We're fresh off our youth mission trip to Mexico and we are still celebrating all that God did while we were there. It's hard to tell you all the things God has done through our youth while on mission. One story is not enough and I don't even have the room in this article to fully express all that happened. Even if I did my words would fall short. Let me say this: If you don't go, you don't know. Church, pray about how God can use you on the mission field. Mission trips deepen our understanding of God, stretch us to grow and strengthen our reliance on God. There is an edge to our faith that we are all willing to walk to. Most of us will stop at that edge where our comfort, knowledge, and security end. I like to call it "The edge of myself." To move past this point would mean that I can no longer rely on myself. I can no longer use my power and understanding to get the job done. But that is not where Jesus wants me to stop and the edge of yourself is not where God wants you to stop. A deeper faith is not found there. A deep and growing faith is found when we are willing to step off the edge and walk into the

unknown. Where if Jesus does not come through, nothing happens. Throughout our mission trip, youth and adults stepped out in faith and Jesus met them there. We saw 68 adults come to faith in Jesus through our door to door evangelism. It was scary, nerve-racking, and fulfilling. When we get our security, knowledge, and worth from Jesus, we no longer have to look for it in the world, and that's a pretty good trade. Through our mission trip, we made that trade.

I really feel that's where we are as a church. We are on the edge of ourselves. We have pushed our way through many changes. There have been many roadblocks and hiccups as we move forward. Now we find ourselves at the edge of what we know. At the same time, God is asking us to push out beyond ourselves. Where if Jesus does not come through, then nothing happens. The changes have been scary, nerve-racking, and fulfilling for many. But as a church, Bro. Mike is leading us past the edge of ourselves. Moving out to the unknown where we must rely on Jesus. This is where Jesus will

deepen our faith and grow us. Where if we are found faithful, we will see more people come to faith in Christ. I want to see myself and other's faith grow and I want to see people come to Christ in faith. I truly believe that will happen when we all move past the edge of ourselves as we Build 4 Generations To Come.

So, thank you church for playing a part in our mission trip. Thank you for praying for us. I can't fully understand it but we felt every prayer lifted up for our team! Thank you for giving so that we could be on mission. Thank you for buying cakes and silent auction items. When you give and pray you are participating in seeing 68 people come to faith in Christ.
