2 Timothy 3:16 NKJV All Scripture *is* given by inspiration of God, and *is* profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness,

- **The meaning of inspiration**

- World’s meaning: When a modern day book is called “inspired,” people mean that its thoughts and writing are elevated beyond a normal level.
- _____ meaning: The Greek for inspiration is “theopneustos” which means “God breathed.”
 - not in the sense that God blew upon the writings and thereby blessed them
 - but in the sense that God blew them _____ of Himself to give to the writers.

- **The means of inspiration**

Often people search for a _____ methodology by which God communicated His truth to men to record. Sometimes people argue, favoring one means of inspiration over another. The testimony of the Scriptures is that God used _____ means of inspiration. One means is not preferable over another. The fact is that through each of the means, God breathed out His Word to the recipient. Let us explore some of those means of inspiration with a sample of each.

- _____ - **God wrote it Himself.**

Exodus 34:1 NKJV And the LORD said to Moses, “Cut two tablets of stone like the first ones, and I will write on *these* tablets the words that were on the first tablets which you broke.

- **Dictation - God dictated word for word, and the human author wrote it down.**

Exodus 34:27 NKJV Then the LORD said to Moses, “Write these words, for according to the tenor of these words I have made a covenant with you and with Israel.”

- _____ - **God showed the author something and told him to write what he saw.**

Revelation 1:11 NKJV saying, “I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last,” and, “What you see, write in a book and send *it* to the seven churches which are in Asia: to Ephesus, to Smyrna, to Pergamos, to Thyatira, to Sardis, to Philadelphia, and to Laodicea.”

- **Research - God revealed the truth through the research of the author.**

Luke 1:1-4 NKJV 1 Inasmuch as many have taken in hand to set in order a narrative of those things which have been fulfilled among us, 2 just as those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and ministers of the word delivered them to us, 3 it seemed good to me also, having had perfect understanding of all things from the very first, to write to you an orderly account, most excellent Theophilus, 4 that you may know the certainty of those things in which you were instructed.

- _____ **first hand experiences - God's revelation came through the experiences of the author.**

2 Peter 1:16 NKJV For we did not follow cunningly devised fables when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but were eyewitnesses of His majesty.

- **Teaching by the Holy Spirit - God revealed truth through the internal testimony of the indwelling Holy Spirit in the life of the author.**

1 Corinthians 2:13 NKJV These things we also speak, not in words which man's wisdom teaches but which the Holy Spirit teaches, comparing spiritual things with spiritual.

- **The results of inspiration**

- **The whole Bible is inspired. This is called Plenary Inspiration (plenary means _____)**

Matthew 4:4 NKJV But He answered and said, "It is written, '*Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.*'"

As we discussed above, the Bible is composed of many _____ of literature. Understanding whether a passage is history or poetry in the original language is important for reading, understanding, and interpreting the text. However, _____ type is inspired; and one type is not more inspired than the other. All of the Bible is inspired.

- **Every word is inspired. _____ Inspiration (Verbal means pertaining to words)**
 - Many mistakenly equate Verbal Inspiration with Mechanical _____
 - Mechanical Dictation means that God dictated the words and man wrote them down mechanically.
 - Some of the Bible was mechanically dictated, but not all.
 - Verbal Inspiration means that whatever the means of inspiration (dictation, vision, research...), the end _____ was that the very words God desired to be used to express His truth were the ones that made it to the page.
 - Jesus referred to the words written by _____ as the word of God.

Mark 7:10-13 NKJV 10 For Moses said, 'Honor your father and your mother'; and, 'He who curses father or mother, let him be put to death.' 11 But you say, 'If a man says to his father or mother, "Whatever profit you might have received from me is Corban"—' (that is, a gift to God), 12 then you no longer let him do anything for his father or his mother, 13 making the word of God of no effect through your tradition which you have handed down. And many such things you do."

- _____ also affirmed that it is the very words which are inspired.

1 Corinthians 2:13 NKJV These things we also speak, not in words which man's wisdom teaches but which the Holy Spirit teaches, comparing spiritual things with spiritual.

- The truth of Verbal Inspiration is in _____ with the popular modern theory called Dynamic Inspiration.
 - Verbal Inspiration - each _____ of the original is inspired.
 - Dynamic Inspiration - only the _____ were inspired, but the human authors selected the words as seemed best to them.
- The human authors of Scripture recognized this distinction and responded in such a way as to affirm Verbal Inspiration. Paul made a major theological point because of the _____ form of a noun was used in Genesis rather than the plural.

Galatians 3:16 NKJV Now to Abraham and his Seed were the promises made. He does not say, "And to seeds," as of many, but as of one, "And to your Seed," who is Christ.

- This truth makes the study of Greek and Hebrew important.
- **Inspiration makes the Bible _____ and infallible.**
 - Inerrant means that in the original autographs, there are no _____.

Matthew 19:3-5 NKJV 3 The Pharisees also came to Him, testing Him, and saying to Him, “Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for *just* any reason?” 4 And He answered and said to them, “Have you not read that He who made *them* at the beginning ‘*made them male and female,*’ 5 and said, ‘*For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh*’?”
